Response Level: 5

Torres and Cape HHS remains at Tier 5 of its Rapid Response Plan with multiple cases in multiple communities.

Business as usual services have been stood down to enable the HHS to mount an appropriate response, including additional testing capacity, contact tracing, positive case and vulnerable patient management. Core functions to continue include: COVID testing, Contact Tracing, Vulnerable Patient Management, Mental Health, Emergency Care, Inpatient Care, Pharmacy, Pathology, Dialysis, Oncology, Maternity, Radiology, Emergency Surgery, Aged Care and Vaccination with GP and outreach services moving to telehealth

All other tests will be transferred to Cairns or elswhere for processing. This may cause a delay to receiving results.
