Response Level: 5

Torres and Cape HHS remains at Tier 5 of its Rapid Response Plan with multiple cases in multiple communities.

Detection of cases overview

TCHHS has identified a significant number of new COVID-19 case in the region today. Due to the volume, the detail and a breakdown of where cases were detected is still being worked through and will likely be reported overnight or first thing in the morning to ensure accuracy of reporting. We can confirm that cases have now been detected at Hopevale and there is now community transmission in Bamaga, Cooktown, Thursday Island and Weipa.

Exposure venues highlighted in yellow are new. After 7 days, exposure sites will be removed. Some exposure sites are still being investigated and will be updated as reported.

HHS Capacity

Rapid response staff have been deployed to various sites to support local teams and additional resources continue to be sought. A huge thank you to Local Disaster Management Group colleagues for support provided so far in our response. It is very much appreciated.

Fever Clinics and Testing

Only people who are symptomatic and those that have been instructed to attend for testing will be tested.

All those experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 will be tested using Rapid Antigen Tests where they are available or via PCR on Point of Care where there are no Rapid Antigen Tests (where it is available). All other tests will be transferred to Cairns or elsewhere for processing. This may cause a delay to receiving results. Rapid Antigen Tests are in short supply nationally and TCHHS will get them out to all communities as quickly as we are able.

Anyone who is symptomatic should come forward for testing.

If an individual tests positive on a Rapid Antigen Test they will be diagnosed as a positive case and they will then receive a swab that will be sent to Cairns for confirmation. The person will still be classed as a positive case.

If an individual tests negative on a Rapid Antigen Test they will be assumed to be negative and are free to go about their day.

Close contacts of a positive case will be notified by public health to attend for testing.

If the close contact has no symptoms they will be tested using a Rapid Antigen Test

- if it is positive they will then receive a swab that will be sent to Cairns for confirmation. The person will still be classed as a positive case.
- If it is negative the person must return home and isolate until day six when they will require a Rapid Antigen Test

If the close contact has symptoms they will be tested via PCR and swabbed. Where available the test will be processed on point of care.

- If it is positive they will be diagnosed as COVID positive
- If it is negative they will need to return home and isolate until day six when they will require Rapid Antigen Test
- All Primary Health Care Centres across the Torres and Cape region offer COVID-19 testing.
- The Fever Clinics at Thursday Island Hospital, Weipa Hospital and Cooktown Hospital are open from 8 am to 5 pm Mon-Fri.
- Thursday Island is a walk in fever clinic
- Cooktown Hospital please call for a time on 04398 44238.
- Weipa Hospital please call 40823611 to arrange a time to come in.
- Please be patient with our staff as queues are possible.

Vaccination

Vaccination clinics are available at Weipa Hospital, Cooktown Community Health, Bamaga PHCC and Thursday Island. Walk ins welcome. Booster doses are available.

All clients are either asymptomatic or have very mild symptoms and being managed via COVID in Home Care (Virtual care)

get tested if they develop symptoms. Please note exposure sites will be removed after 7 days.
