MO13.6	 Land uses and lots located in areas that are subject to natural hazards include: (a) methods of notifying residents, employees and visitors of the natural hazard risk; (b) management controls to ensure that residents, employees and visitors are able to evacuate if required, including the identification of a designated evacuation area; and (c) access to facilities and services necessary to mitigate impacts associated with the natural hazard risk. Note – An example of a facility or service for the purposes of paragraph (c) is the provision of a water supply for fire fighting where within a <u>bushfire hazard area</u>.
MO13.7	 Development for Reconfiguring a Lot ensures that the resulting lot layout: (a) is responsive to the natural hazard risk of the <u>site;</u> (b) uses areas subject to natural hazard risk for purposes that are compatible with the nature of risk; (c) allows for the appropriate location of future buildings to achieve an acceptable or tolerable risk for future uses; (d) includes buffering to, or separation from, areas subject to natural hazard risk; (e) facilitates the safe evacuation of people, if required due to a natural hazard; and (f) facilitates access for emergency services, as appropriate.
MO13.8	 <u>Hard to evacuate uses</u> are not established or intensified in an area that is subject to a natural hazard unless: (a) there is an overriding need in the public interest for the new or expanded service the development provides; (b) there are no other suitable alternative locations within the required catchment; and (c) site planning can appropriately mitigate the risk.
