

MO16.1	The clearing of vegetation is avoided to the greatest extent practical, particularly where involving mature and/or native vegetation. Where the clearing of vegetation cannot be reasonably avoided, the adverse impacts of clearing are minimised.
MO16.2	Retained vegetation is used as a feature within the development and use of land. Note – This may be best achieved through incorporation of retained vegetation in proposed landscaping areas.
MO16.3	Vegetation clearing does not result in areas of land becoming unstable or increases in likelihood of landslip.
MO16.4	Vegetation clearing does not result in a degradation in the scenic quality of foreshore or hilltop areas.
MO16.5	Vegetation clearing does not result in a reduction in the amenity of residents.
MO16.6	Despite MO16.1 to MO16.5, vegetation clearing may be undertaken where it is demonstrated that the clearing is necessary to maintain public safety.
